Alcove is designed for women with addiction disorders and offers a holistic, trauma responsive, abstinence, and recovery-based model for co-occurring issues of addiction, mental health distress, and abuse history. Holistic counselling strives to meet the physical, emotional, spiritual, occupational, and social needs of clients in a safe and supportive environment to establish a clear recovery process.

The program offers two 12 week streams: an individual live-in program and a live-in program for mothers and children. Alcove additionally offers accommodation and programs that keep families intact and allows mothers and their children to remain together during recovery.



Wait Time and Length of Stay: Source Program Data











Aspen - Eating Disorder Community Support Home

Aspen contracts with AHS Calgary Zone to provide support to young adults aged 14 to 23 years who attend the Eating Disorder Program. The Eating Disorder Community Support Home program provides a supportive living environment for young persons attending the Eating Disorder Day Treatment program at the Alberta Children's Hospital.

Support homes are recruited from the Calgary community to provide temporary residence, transportation, support, and encouragement in the development of healthy lifestyle changes. Support workers train, supervise, and assist the support home providers and also work with clients and staff from the Eating Disorder Program.












Aspen - Eating Disorder Community Support Home






Aventa - Phase II Short-Term Residential

Aventa provides concurrent capable, trauma informed and gender responsive addiction treatment to meet the unique needs of women. Aventa incorporates a client and family centered care approach to our services. Historically, over 98% of women accessing treatment services at Aventa have suffered from trauma and 88% also concurrently report a mental health issue.

Phase II is a six-week, intensive live-in program that provides therapeutic individual and group counselling and focuses on the following four key areas: sexual, spiritual, relationships, and self.












Aventa - Phase II Short-Term Residential








Aventa - Phase III Long-Term Residential

Aventa provides concurrent capable, trauma informed and gender responsive addiction treatment to meet the unique needs of women. Aventa incorporates a client and family centered care approach to our services.

Phase III is a three month live-in treatment program for women who have completed the Phase II component or Young Adult Treatment (YAT) program. This program offers therapeutic individual and group counselling with a strong educational and skill building component.



Calgary Alpha House

The Calgary Alpha House is an organization providing services to those who are under the influence of, or withdrawing from, alcohol and/or other drugs and require assistance in stabilizing their condition. The program provides a safe, caring environment for individuals whose lives are affected by alcohol and substance dependencies.

The purpose of the organization is to provide support and promote well-being through several programs including shelter, detoxification, outreach, housing, and encampment. The treatment is based on three primary stages; harm reduction philosophy, change model, and self-help recovery programs.



The Calgary Urban Project Society (CUPS) operates an Opioid Dependency Service, which is an integrated primary care and opioid replacement therapy program.

The program is a collaborative integration of family physicians, nurses, psychiatrists, social workers and mental health workers who have been trained to provide treatment of methadone, suboxone or buprenorphine to opioid patients accessing CUPS programs.



Calgary Alternative Support Services - Creative Community Living Activities

Calgary Alternative Support Services (CASS) is a non-profit agency that provides support to people with disabilities. Creative Community Living Activities (CCLA) is a group day program created by CASS for adults suffering from severe and persistent mental illness.

CCLA provides ongoing assessment and support with qualified, experienced staff who have an understanding of group dynamics, therapeutic counselling modalities, and crisis intervention to provide a combination of medical and psychosocial approaches. The services ensure continuity of care to prevent or reduce the need for hospitalization.



CMHA - Continuing Connections

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Continuing Connections program supports individuals living in one of four partnering long-term care centres: Glamorgan, Bethany, Dr. Vernon Fanning, and Garrison Green. The objectives of the program are to support the recovery and renewal of hope through assisting individuals to increase their community interactions, confidence levels, and to facilitate healthy living opportunities.

Through the leisure/recreation component, residents are encouraged to participate in social, recreational, and leisure activities to increase skill building, social interaction, and community integration. Residents may participate in group activities and/or be matched with a volunteer for individual social visits to promote meaningful relationships.



This group homes provide 24-hour transitional support to individuals discharged from an inpatient mental health unit within Calgary. The home has the support of an AHS nurse and shared support from a psychiatrist to provide consultation and medication management.

Many clients experience concurrent disorders which may include substance abuse, secondary mental health conditions, and/or medical diagnoses. Treatment is focused on recovery, life skills, community re-integration, and wellness with the intent to transition to other community programs when clients are deemed ready.



CMHA - Independent Living Support Program

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Independent Living Support Program (ILS) encourages mental health clients to live as independently as their disorder will allow. The program provides emotional support and assistance with developing living skills including budgeting, cooking, and self-care, as well as coping skills to better manage their condition.

Services are provided through AHS Addiction & Mental Health clinics and referrals come directly from clinic staff to the ILS Coordinator from the NW Clinic, Carnat Centre, Reality Challenged Clinic, NE Clinic, and South Clinic.

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Leisure Recreation program contributes to client recovery, wellness, and community integration by providing low or no-cost group activities for adults with mental health challenges to participate in and learn interpersonal skills within the structure of social and recreational activities.

Clients participating in the program benefit from increased opportunities for interpersonal skill building, guided socialization, building community networks, physical and mental health enhancement, increased recreational skills and activity interests, promotion and involvement in leadership opportunities, and the opportunity to travel outside of Calgary.

CMHA - Peer Options

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Peer Options program provides a recovery-based continuity of support for individuals transitioning toward greater independence in the community. Adults with a mental health disorder can benefit from developing peer and recovery-based skills they can use as a foundation to form and sustain healthy relationships, helping to support a healthy and confident transition into the community.

This is achieved through the delivery of peer support groups and drop-in and mentoring. As a result, participants are better able to build a natural support network and are less reliant on professional supports.

CMHA - Street Outreach & Stabilization

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Street Outreach & Stabilization program works to link homeless adults experiencing mental illness to essential services. There is both a non-Indigenous and an Indigenous component to the SOS program that allows the team to address cultural differences.

Services include extensive outreach efforts to engage homeless persons with the objective to link them to a comprehensive range of community services including psychiatric care, addiction services, housing referrals, social support, primary health care, and community support services that can prevent the recurrence of homelessness.



CMHA - Supportive Living

The Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Supportive Living program offers comprehensive and specialized mental health support services within residential settings. Two models of supported living programming are available; group living (Marguerite House and Miner House) and independent apartments (Alice Bissett, Bob Ward, Horizon West, and Horizon 14).

The goal of the Supportive Living program is to assist clients to enhance and/or maintain their level of independence. The degree of support and frequency of contact with the Supportive Living Coordinators varies, ranging from daily 24 -hour staff support in some programs to weekly/monthly contact in others.



Distress Centre

The Distress Centre is a non-profit social agency that delivers 24-hour support, counselling, and resource referral services to Calgary and the surrounding area. The agency is built around the belief that anyone can experience crisis and services are provided without discrimination.

While a call to the 24-hour crisis line is often a first step towards finding a solution, not all problems are solved over the phone. For complex situations, Distress Centre's counselling program provides face-to-face, short-term counselling at no fee to individuals, couples, and families. Emergency and evening appointments are available.



Lasting Impressions is designed to strengthen and support families impacted by parental mental illness. Community support involves support networks and supportive community links.



The Living Alternatives for the Mentally Disabled Association (LAMDA) provides independent living support for individuals afflicted with severe and persistent mental illness resulting in a significant level of disability, particularly those with schizophrenia. Support workers offer social, leisure, educational, and skill development activities.






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Potential Place Society

The Alex Community Health Centre

The Complex Care Clinic operates out of the Alex Community Health Centre, with support from Mosaic Primary Care Network and Alberta Health Services, is designed to support vulnerable Calgarians better meet their Health Care needs. The Enhanced Youth Wellness program supports young people accessing treatment for mental health and/or addictions through the AHS program, Adolescent Day Treatment Program (ADTP). Wood's Homes - Community Psychiatric Unit

The Community Psychiatric Unit is a partnership between AHS and Wood's Homes that provides short term (5-14 days) residential treatment and in-home follow up support to children and adolescents experiencing a significant mental health issue. Eight beds are serviced by a team of Nurses, Psychiatrists, a Clinician, and Youth and Family Counsellors. There is also a partnership with Calgary Board of Education providing on-site schooling.

Assessment, diagnosis, support, safety planning, medication management, and establishing clear goals to move forward out of a crisis are the focus of the short term treatment stay. Admissions to the program are either directly from the Emergency Department or a step-down from another AHS acute care unit.

Addiction & Mental Health—Child & Adolescent Contracted Services

Community Capacity Grant Agencies & Restrictive Funding Grant Agencies

Community Capacity Grant Agencies

Community Capacity Grants are agreements or initiatives between Alberta Health Services and contracted community agencies (Rural Communities, Municipalities, Rural Schools and Victim Services Associations), whose purpose is to provide and increase community services for addiction and mental health across the Calgary zone. These services target individuals, families, students, and victims within their jurisdictions. In order to qualify, agencies receiving these grants must meet the following criteria, which sets them apart from regular contracted services.

- Funding to the program is no greater than \$150,000 per year
- The duration of the grant is not less than 6 months and not more than 36 months
- The program must be supported by a business plan for the duration of the funding
- AHS is not the sole funder to the program
- The agencies are independent on how they ran and provide the funded services AHS is not involved
- The agencies are not-for-profit in nature

CAPACITY GRANT	DESCRIPTION
Bow Valley Victim Services Association: Victim Support Services for Banff, Canmore, and Bow Valley	The Bow Valley Victim Services Association (BVVSA) provides direct assistance to individuals who have experienced injury, loss, or trauma due to a crime or traumatic event. Individuals beyond the immediate victim to whom the repercussion of a crime/trauma may have spread (including friends, family, and co-workers) are also assisted. The program serves the communities of Canmore, Banff, Lake Louise, Exshaw, Kananaskis, Harvie Heights, Lac Des Arcs, Dead Man's Flat, and Saskatchewan River Crossing. This includes services to over 5 million annual visitors to this area (if required).
Calgary Alternative Support Services (CASS): Langin Place Support Program	CASS provides housing services to male adults (26 to 70 years old) who are deemed "Hard to House" or have had difficulty maintaining housing in the past and are experiencing substance abuse and/or mental health issues. The program uses case management to provide the service in a harm reduction model. Clients are either self referred or are referred by community agencies, hospitals, or correctional facilities.
Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter: Healthy Relationship Program	 The Healthy Relationship Program serves male and female adolescents aged between 12 to 18 years (flexibility around age criteria) who are at risk of being victimized and/or perpetrating abuse within their significant relationships and meet at least one of the following criteria: There is a known or suspected history of family conflict and/or abuse in the young person's family of origin or in their current living situation. There is known or suspected abuse occurring in the context of a young person's dating relationships and/or the youth has had difficulty maintaining healthy dating relationships. The youth experiences conflict in or around the school setting, involving peers, and/or school personnel. The youth experiences difficulty getting along with others.
Canadian Mental Health Association: Suicide Support Program	The Suicide Support Program provides Suicide Education and Bereavement to youth age 11 to 18 years old, attending middle, junior, and senior high schools in Calgary and area. The program delivers presentations to students at post-secondary institutions. Suicide Education is facilitated by CMHA - Education Coordinators to teachers and parent groups wishing to receive further sessions. The program provides support to schools in rural areas both in-person and online through resource packages. Bereavement provides counselling, groups, and supportive services for children, individuals, couples, and families living in the Calgary area, who have been impacted by suicide of a loved one, known as 'survivors'. Suicide Education is provided by the Mental Health Education Program at CMHA, which educates youth and other groups about mental illness and stress management.

Distress Centre Calgary: Child/Youth and Mobile Response Team (MRT) Crisis Call Line Program	Distress Centre's crisis call support services are available 24 hours a day and are free of charge to everyone in Calgary and area. Distress Centre's 24 hour crisis line is a publicly listed number to access the Alberta Health Services Mobile Response Team (MRT). Distress Centre screens calls for appropriateness to MRT services. Then, based on established protocols, appropriate calls will be patched directly to the Mobile Response Team with the caller's permission. While callers can rely on the empathetic, confidential crisis support from Distress Centre volunteers, those who would benefit from a deeper assessment, consultation, or an in person visit are referred to MRT. In general only callers who are 18 years and over are connected to MRT - calls related to youth are connected to other mobile partners. Distress Centre also provides coverage for overflow calls for both the Social Services Response Team (SSRT) and Wood's Homes Community Resource Team (CRT).
Foothills Regional Victim Services Association: Victim Support Services for High River and Municipal District of Foothills	Foothills Victim Services provides support, information, and referrals to Victims of Crime and/or Tragedy within the RCMP detachment areas covered by the High River, Okotoks, Turner Valley, and Nanton detachments. This encompasses the Municipal Districts (MD) of Foothills and part of Willow Creek. The agency also provides Court Orientation and Court Accompaniment to victims/witnesses of criminal code offences. The services are also available to victims of a crime within their geographical areas. Referrals to the agency are received from the RCMP, other Police services, Emergency Services, Crown Prosecutors, other community groups, or by self-referral.
Foothills School Division No. 38: Family - School Liaison Counsellor Program.	Family School Liaison Counsellors (FSLC) work with educators and other service providers to assist students and their families who are studying within the school district. The program provides the first line of crisis intervention and family intervention, establishes supportive relationships with students and their families, provides counselling services, networking with community services, liaises with appropriate service agencies, worksas part of the Critical Response Team, and makes referrals to appropriate community services. The program provides counselling to students and youth 6 - 18 years old who are deemed complex and diagnosed with: Autism Spectrum Disorder, ADHD, ADD, ODD, Anxiety, PTSD, Eating Disorders, or Academic Learning Disabilities. The program also provides support to students and their families who have issues related to housing, legal, and environmental, as well as difficulties in accessing outside counselling. The program's geographic service area covers the Municipal District of Foothills South to Cayley, including Okotoks, High River, Black Diamond, Millarville, and Longview.
Hull Services: Safe Directions Program	 The Safe Directions Program operates three services targeting youth and children ages 10 to 18 years who are suffering from addiction problems. a) Secure Services - provides assessment and stabilization services for children and youth for up to 30 days who are considered to be at immediate risk to themselves or others, for whom less intrusive interventions have proved insufficient to reduce the risk, and require a period of confinement for the purposes of stabilization, assessment, and discharge planning. b) Reflections Services - provides stabilization and treatment to youth for up to 47 days who are at risk for being sexually exploited in the community. c) Stepping Stones - provides further stabilization, assessment, and transitional services to youth who have been discharged from Secure Services or Reflections and can vary in length of stay, but typically 60 days is recommended. Referrals to the programs are made from Region 3, Calgary and Area Child and Family Services. The Secure Services and Reflections Programs are considered to be provincial resources and are available to serve young people from other regions.

CAPACITY GRANT	DESCRIPTION
Organization for Bipolar Affective Disorders Society: Peer Support Program	Organization for Bipolar Affective Disorders Society (OBAD) provides peer support and information services to adults affected either directly or indirectly by a severe and persistent Mood Disorder such as Bipolar Disorder, Unipolar Depression or Schizoaffective Disorder. OBAD runs peer support groups for individuals and family members in Calgary, Red Deer and Edmonton. It provides education and support through a unique website, telephone inquiries, public presentations, literature, and resources. The program was established in 1988 and serves afflicted individuals 18 years old and over. There is no formal intake for clients to join the program. Referrals to the agency are either self or from community agencies.
Palliser Regional School Division No. 26: Family - School Liaison Counsellor Program for Vulcan, AB	The Family School Liaison Counsellor (FSLC) program promotes identification and prevention of problems among students, parents, and/or the school, facilitating a proactive approach to problem solving. The Family School Liaison Counsellor assists students who have been identified as being at-risk as a result of behavioural and/or emotional problems. students are identified as presenting risk factors including: social, emotional, and/or behavioural difficulties. Students may also refer themselves with learning difficulties, inappropriate classroom behaviour, lack of motivation, and/or problems relating to unresolved past issues, peer relations, suicide risks, dealing with trauma, drugs/alcohol, chronic depression, running away from home, promiscuity, or aggressive behaviour. Family School Liaison Counsellors meet with students and/or their parents or guardians initially to discuss concerns and presenting problems. The counsellor will work with the student and/or parents/guardians to develop counselling goals and a plan for support. Involvement in the Family School Liaison program is voluntary and parents/guardians and students have the right to stop counselling by notifying the counsellor. The target population for the Palliser North Family School Liaison Program are students from ECS through to Grade 12 attending community schools in the Town of Vulcan and the County of Vulcan, including an alternative faith-based school, Brant Christian School located in Brant, Alberta.
Schizophrenia Society of Alberta: Unsung Heroes Program	SSA's Unsung Heroes Program provides one-on-one support, group meetings, recreational activities, and links to other social programs for Calgary residents who are experiencing schizophrenia and related disorders. The program's aim is to address prejudice/discrimination, basic needs, physical health, addictions, access to recreation, housing and homelessness, mental health and wellbeing, home care, loneliness, and isolation, and to encourage participation in community life.
Schizophrenia Society of Alberta: Partnership Education Program	SSA's Partnership Education Program targets individuals or family members recovering from schizophrenia or a related disorders. The program's target population receives educational sessions delivered by the Partnership Program to high schools, colleges and universities, community and congregational groups, medical and justice students, professionals, and other non-profit organizations.
Schizophrenia Society of Alberta: Peer Support Outreach Program	SSA's Peer Support Outreach Program is an innovative program that provides outreach peer support to those in difficulty due to schizophrenia and provides employment opportunities for those who have schizophrenia and are living productive lives in the community. The program enlists, trains, and employs people who have schizophrenia and have expertise, knowledge of the disorder of schizophrenia, knowledge of the mental health system, and the personal desire to visit and assist others. The Peer Support Outreach Program recognizes that outreach workers have developed specialized skills in coping with their own disorder and that through sharing their experiences they can provide a much needed service to others with schizophrenia.

CAPACITY GRANT	DESCRIPTION
Schizophrenia Society of Alberta: Family Support Program	SSA's Family Support Program targets individuals who have a loved one diagnosed with schizophrenia, psychosis, or related disorders. This can include, but is not limited to: parents, grandparents, siblings, spouses, extended family members, friends, co-workers, and other professionals. The Family Support Program offers information, guidance, and support through resources on schizophrenia and related disorders. In addition to providing crisis management, emotional support, and goal development with family members, the Family Support Program Coordinator provides education to improve the understanding of
	schizophrenia and related disorders, various treatment options, the mental health system, legal issues (trusteeship, guardianship, etc.), housing/financial resources, and additional supports found within Alberta Health Services and the broader community. Goals are met through individual/family consultations conducted in person, telephone, or email. In an effort to ensure continuity of care, a minimum of one follow-up call is provided to all individuals who access services within the Family Support Program.
Town of Claresholm - Claresholm Community and Family Support Services: Outreach and Support	Claresholm Community and Family Support Services provides counselling support and outreach services to families and individuals who are experiencing crisis situations, having difficulty accessing services, requesting housing, filling forms/tax forms, and managing daily life/other family issues. The program works with people of all ages and backgrounds. The programs serve all residents within the Town of Claresholm and the surrounding rural communities. Residents with or without a mental health diagnosis are eligible to access the
Program	program.
Town of Okotoks: Okotoks Family Resource Centre	The Okotoks Family Resource Centre is a community based service available to residents of Okotoks who are in need of information, support, or referrals. Clients can self refer and are able to access services by phone, email, or walk-in. The Resource Centre is also an information hub for professionals in the community seeking information on services and programs to support their clients.
Vulcan Regional Victim Services Association:	The Victim Support Services program specifically provides: crisis response, general assistance to emergency, referrals, information, public education, crime prevention, and critical incident stress management. The population served by the agency includes all
Victim Support Services Program	residents and visitors in the area of the County of Vulcan, served by the Vulcan RCMP detachments. The area includes the towns of Vulcan, Champion, Carmagay, Lomond, and Milo as well as the hamlets of Brant, Kirkaldy, Queenstown, Little Bow Resort, Lake McGregor Resort, and Hutterite colonies. Referrals to the agency come from the RCMP, Vulcan Emergency Services, and the Vulcan Community Health Care facility.
Wood's Home:	Wood's Exit Program is a drop-in centre and outreach program that provides a number of services to all youth (male, female, transgender, and LGBTQ) living on the street between
Exit Program	the ages of 12-24. The drop in storefront service makes connections with youth who are street-involved or disconnected from their families/homes and assists them in their moment of crisis. There is no mandate or restriction as to the geographical residence of the clients, or on mental or physical health status. The program has an on-site medical clinic that is staffed by adolescent medicine specialists and nurses, providing free physical and mental health care. It also provides services and supports to young people who may be at risk of involvement in sexual exploitation or entrenched in the sex trade. Through counselling and referral to resources, young people are assisted in moving away from the streets and are encouraged to utilize the available supportive and caring services. The EXIT Mobile Van provides crisis support and assistance with basic needs to youth and families in various communities. The van also provides schools in various communities with crisis and outreach support, as well as addressing the needs of the youth to maintain enrollment, improved attendance, respectful attitudes, and academic success.

Restrictive Funding Grant Agencies

These are contracted agencies designated by AHS as recipients of a funding grant issued by the Government of Alberta. The grant is restrictive because the recipient's use of the funds is limited to specific activities or expenditures in the contracted project. The recipients are selected for the grant due to their expertise in providing the unique requirements of the specific project funded by the Government of Alberta.

Hospice Calgary Society:	The program provides grief support and counselling to children, adolescents, and their parents/caregivers who are grieving after a death or facing life threatening illnesses in

Simon House Recovery Centre:	The program provides long-term residential treatment to men suffering from issues related to recovery and relapse prevention for alcohol and drug addiction. The program treatment is based on therapy, life skills support, and multi-disciplinary techniques that
Residential Addiction Treatment for Men	are designed to support clients long-term recovery. The agency also provides post active treatment services namely: Supportive Transitional Housing and Independent Sober Living.
Walter A. Slim Thorpe Recovery Centre Society: Residential Addiction	The agency is a community-based adult addiction residential treatment recovery and detox facility in Blackfoot, Alberta. The agency provides non-medical residential treatment to men suffering from addictions to: alcohol, gambling, sex, and eating disorders. AHS funds 4 beds of the agency's residential addiction treatment recovery
Treatment for Men	program.
Calgary Urban Project Society:	The agency provides mental health services, housing, and supports to individuals suffering from mental health disorders who are already receiving services from other CUPS programs. The funding grant is to help CUPS expand (additional staffing) the
Shared Care Mental Program (Pathways to Resiliency)	program to accommodate the increasing number of clients accessing the program.

Glossary of Terms

TERM	DEFINITION
Activity Statistics	A summary of registered client activities provided by the service, including direct and/or indirect activities. Some programs may also collect other relevant program activities. Note: Different activity statistics are collected for each program and caution should be taken in comparing this data across programs.
Addiction	Addiction is a primary, chronic disease, characterized by impaired control over the use of a psychoactive substance and/ or behaviour.
Age	For this report, a client's age in years is calculated as of their enrolment date in the service or is reported as provided in the Client Information and Activity Report.
Assessment	An investigation into the client's status and related factors, required to identify service needs and the type, level and frequency of service interventions required to meet those needs.
Client	An individual receiving service. This term is generally used for community and outpatient services.
Client Statistics	A summary of client statistics including age, gender, place of residence, and diagnostic categories or presenting problems. Unless otherwise specified, this information is reported for overall registrations within the service.
Clinic	A facility, a service within a facility, or a specific provider that provides a specific activity or group of activities.
Detox (or Detoxification)	Treatment and/or rehabilitation activities provided for clients whose biomedical, emotional and/or behavioural problems are severe enough to require individualized medical/psychiatric care until stabilized. The treatment is intended to assist the individual in stabilizing and managing his/her medical/psychiatric problems, while also addressing the addiction problem.
Diagnostic Category	Typically includes both formal diagnoses as well as provisional diagnoses from the DSM-5 diagnostic categories. For this report, the graph represents all diagnoses, not just the principal. More than one diagnosis is often recorded and reported for each client.
Direct Activities	Appointments, sessions, contacts, interventions, or procedures directly with clients or those acting in the interest of clients (family, significant other), either over the phone or in person.
Discharge	Termination of a client from a service and/or program or provider. The number of discharges reported include all client registrations with a discharge date during the reporting period.
Discharge Disposition	The client's anticipated location or status following discharge (e.g. Completed Service, Client Withdrew, etc.).

Glossary of Terms

TERM	DEFINITION
Gender	For this report, gender is reported in the following categories: Male, Female, Other.
Group	A collection of individuals based on specific criteria receiving services (e.g. group therapy). Note: Group activity is tracked differently depending on the program.
Indirect Activities	Contacts or interventions related to, but not directly involving, the client(s), (e.g. Planning/Preparation, Documentation, etc.).
Intervention	Activities undertaken to address the client's needs and goals. May include information, guidance, education, therapy, treatment, personal support and other support services.
Length of stay (LOS)	A term used to measure the duration of a single episode of care for a client. Length of stay is measured as the time between enrolment date and discharge date.
New Enrolments	The number of clients enrolled or admitted into the service during the given reporting period. This includes all client registrations with an enrolment date during the reporting period.
Outpatient Treatment	Treatment provided on a non-residential basis, usually in a regularly scheduled session. A client who is not an inpatient (not hospitalized) but instead is cared for elsewhere - as in a doctor's office, clinic, or treatment centre. Outpatient care is also called ambulatory care.
Overall Registrations	A count of all clients with an open enrolment in the service at any point in time during the given reporting period. This includes all new enrolments plus clients that were already active or receiving service within the timeframe.
Patient	An individual receiving service. This term is generally used for inpatient services.
Place of Residence	The primary residence that a client claims as their permanent home or the establishment to where they intend to return.
Presenting Problem	The problem(s) that a client presents to the program with. Presenting problems may include generic diagnoses (e.g. depression) as well as other problems (e.g. abuse).
Program	Organization of single or multiple services.
Program Statistics	A summary of registered client program utilization numbers provided by the service including referrals, new enrolments, discharges, overall and unique registrations, wait time, and length of stay.

Glossary of Terms

TERM	DEFINITION
Referral	A request for service or consult from a professional, person, or group; a person whose case has been referred to a specialist or professional group. The number of referrals reported includes all client registrations with a referral date during the reporting period.
Referral Disposition	The client's anticipated destination (i.e. referred to sources) following discharge (e.g. Community Agency, Mental Health Service).
Unique Individuals Served	A count of all unique individual clients with an open enrolment in the service during the given reporting period. Repeat clients to a service are only counted once in order to get a true number of individuals receiving service.
Wait Time	Measured as the time between referral date and enrolment date. This can be measured as an average (mean) or median (the middle number in a given sequence of numbers). Also refers to the length of time a client remains on a waiting list prior to enrolment into a service.

Appendix: Program and Client Statistics

Program Statistics:

Program statistics are provided for the last three fiscal years to show service volumes and changes over time. Reviewing trends in available program statistics can be helpful for service monitoring and planning. See below for definitions of the indicators available within the Contracted Services Annual Report.

Definitions for Contracted Services:

Referrals

The number of referrals is a count of all requests for service with a referral date recorded during the fiscal year, regardless whether the client was accepted into the program. If a potential client is referred to the service more than once, each referral would be counted.

New Enrolments

The number of new enrolments is a count of all client registrations with an enrolment date during the fiscal year. If the same client is enrolled to the service more than once, each enrolment would be counted.

Overall Registrations

The number of overall registrations is a count of all clients with an open enrolment in the service at any point in time during the fiscal year. Includes new enrolments and clients already involved in the service within the timeframe.

Unique Individuals Served

The number of unique individuals served is a count of all unique clients with an open enrolment to the service at any point in time during the fiscal year. Repeat clients to the service are only counted once.

Discharges

The number of discharges is a count of all client registrations with a discharge date during the fiscal year.

Wait Time and Length of Stay:

Wait time and length of stay are common performance measures used for providing an indication of how well services are meeting client demand and the length of treatment duration. See below for definitions of wait time and length of stay.

Wait Time

Wait time is measured as the time between referral date and enrolment date. For the purpose of this report, wait time is reported for new enrolments during the fiscal year. For community and outpatient services, wait time generally refers to the number of days that a client remains on a waiting list prior to enrolment into a service.

Length of Stay

Length of stay or treatment duration is measured as the time between enrolment date and discharge date. For the purpose of this report, length of stay is reported for discharges during the fiscal year. Length of stay generally refers to the duration of a single episode of care for a client.

Appendix: Program and Client Statistics

Activity Statistics:

Client activity statistics are provided for the current fiscal year to show the breakdown of direct activities, indirect activities, and group activities. The specific activities collected vary according to the program. As activity data collection is not standardized, comparisons should not be made across programs.

Direct Activities

Direct activities typically refer to interventions, procedures, or contacts with clients or those that acting in the interest of the clients' treatment or care. Some examples include individual treatment, family treatment, or group sessions.

Indirect Activities

Indirect activities typically refer to interventions, procedures, or contacts related to, but not directly involving the client. Some examples include consultation or collateral activities when the client is not present.

Group Activities

Group activities typically refer to group sessions with clients and may provide group therapy, mental health education, recreational activities, etc. Group activities are only applicable for some services.

Client Statistics:

Client demographic statistics are provided for the current fiscal year to show the distribution of age, gender, diagnostic categories, and place of residence information for clients served. This information is typically reported for overall registrations to the service.

Age and Gender

Age in years is reported according to applicable age categories for the population. Age is calculated from the date of birth to the enrolment date with the service. The gender of clients is presented in a pie graph format and the age of clients is presented in a bar graph.

Diagnostic Categories

Diagnosis or presenting problem information collected and reported for the majority of services include all diagnoses supplied by the programs and are grouped into diagnostic categories from the DSM-5 or presenting problem areas. The bar graph represents all diagnoses or problems and clients may be represented in more than one category as they often have more than one diagnosis or problem.

Place of Residence

The place of residence is determined by the client's postal code or from the information supplied by the service. Should a client move within the fiscal year, the postal code may be updated. The place of residence graph reflect client distribution in Calgary quadrants based on the most current postal code or the quadrant supplied by the service.

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
